


The Solemn Liturgy of the Last Supper



WELCOME

We're glad that you are here in God's house. This booklet contains everything you need to follow the service. If Anglican worship is unfamiliar to you, that's okay. Prioritize taking it all in with an open heart. Children of all ages are welcome at Christ Church. They are treasures from God. Feel free to move around the church during the service, if that's helpful for keeping your children engaged.

ABOUT THE SERVICE

Today is Maundy Thursday. On this day, Jesus celebrated his final meal with his disciples. At dinner, he gave them the "new commandment" to love one another, and demonstrated this love by taking the role of a servant and washing his disciples' feet. ("Maundy" refers to this new "mandate" for Jesus' disciples.) Jesus also identified the bread and the wine at the table as his Body and Blood which would be offered on the cross the next day, and commanded his disciples to continue celebrating that ritual meal a memorial of his passion and death. This is the Holy Eucharist, which is the church's principal act of worship. After supper, Jesus went to the Garden of Gethsemane to pray, and there he was betrayed by his disciple Judas and arrested.

In our Holy Week services, we become participants in the humility, suffering, sacrifice, and ultimate resurrection of Christ by re-enacting these events. The priest, as a symbol of Christ, will wash the disciples' feet. A loaf of bread from our holy table will be consecrated and taken to the Altar of Repose at the back of the church, to be taken and broken at our Good Friday service tomorrow, just as Jesus awaited his betrayal and his cross by praying in the Garden of Gethsemane.

It is customary, as much as possible, to fast between the end of the Maundy Thursday service and the first Easter service, especially on Good Friday. The services of Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, and Easter morning are considered one continuous service, which is why they do not conclude with a blessing and you are asked either to leave in silence or to remain in quiet prayer.

Rite of Footwashing

Priest

Fellow servants of our Lord Jesus Christ: On the night before his death, Jesus set an example for his disciples by washing their feet, an act of humble service. He taught that strength and growth in the life of the kingdom of God come not by worldly power and authority, but by such lowly service.

Therefore, I invite you, who share in the royal priesthood of Christ, to come forward, that we may recall whose servants we are by following the example of our Master. Come now remembering his admonition that what will be done for you is also to be done by you to others. Engrave on your hearts and mirror in your actions Jesus' words: "A servant is not greater than his master, nor is one who is sent greater than the one who sent him. If you know these things, blessed are you if you do them."

Members of the congregation may then approach to have their feet washed by the priest. While washing the feet, the priest repeats the words of Jesus:

Do you understand what I have done to you? If I then, your Lord and Teacher, have washed your feet, you also ought to wash one another's feet.

A new commandment I give to you, that you love one another: just as I have loved you, you also are to love one another.

(*Priest*) Almighty God, our heavenly Father, who in his great mercy has promised forgiveness of sins to all those who sincerely repent and with true faith turn to him, have mercy upon you, + pardon and deliver you from all your sins, confirm and strengthen you in all goodness, and bring you to everlasting life; through Jesus Christ our Lord. *Amen.*

(Minister) Hear what comforting words our Saviour Christ says to all who truly turn to him: Come to me, all who labor and are heavy laden, and I will give you rest. God so loved the world, that he gave

his only-begotten Son, that whoever believes in him should not perish but have eternal life. Hear also what Saint Paul says: This saying is trustworthy and deserving of full acceptance, that Christ Jesus came into the world to save sinners. Hear also what Saint John says: If anyone sins, we have an advocate with the Father, Jesus Christ the righteous, and he is the propitiation for our sins.

Collects Priest

Sermon

Please be seated after the priest makes the sign of the cross.

Intercession

The priest brings the bread and wine into the midst of the people, to later present them at the altar with the people's prayers. The priest bids the people to pray. Then the minister reads several petitions. After each the priest and people say,

Let us pray to the Lord.

Lord, have mercy.

Offertory Sentence

Priest, then all together

Yours, O Lord, is the greatness, and the power, and the glory, and the victory, and the majesty: for everything in heaven and on earth is yours; yours is the Kingdom, O Lord, and you are exalted as Head above all. All things come from you, O Lord.

Prayer of Consecration

Priest

Blessing and glory and thanksgiving are yours ...

The priest continues the prayer, which concludes,

By him, and with him, and in him, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all honor and glory is yours, Almighty Father, now and for ever. *Amen.*

And now as our Savior Christ hath commanded and taught us, we are bold to pray:

Our Father who art in heaven, hallowed be thy Name, thy kingdom come, thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread; and forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us; and lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. For thine is the kingdom, the power, and the glory, for ever and ever. Amen.

Peace

Preparation for Communion

Kneeling

We do not presume to come to this your table, O merciful Lord, trusting in our own right-eousness, but in your abundant and great mercies. We are not worthy so much as to gather up the crumbs under your table; but you are the same Lord whose character is always to have mercy. Grant us, therefore, gracious Lord, so to eat the flesh of your dear Son Jesus Christ, and to drink his blood, that our sinful bodies may be made clean by his body, and our souls washed through his most precious blood, and that we may evermore dwell in him, and he in us. Amen.

Holy Communion

Then the priest and minister distribute Holy Communion at the altar rail. Everyone is welcome to approach the altar—believers and non-believers, and members of all denominations. Holy Communion is about renewing our participation in the death and resurrection of Jesus which be initiate in baptism and continue by faith. If you have not been baptized or do not believe in Jesus, you may still come forward. Just cross your arms over your chest to indicate that you would prefer to receive a blessing rather than the Body and Blood of Christ.

Go to dark Gethsemane, ye that feel the tempter's power. Your Redeemer's conflict see; watch with him one bitter hour; turn not from his griefs away, learn of Jesus Christ to pray.

Follow to the judgement hall; view the Lord of life arraigned. O the wormwood and gall! O the grief his soul sustained! Shun not suffering, shame, or loss; learn of him to bear the cross.

Calvary's mournful mountain climb; there, adoring at his feet, mark that miracle of time—God's own sacrifice complete. "It is finished!" hear him cry; learn of Jesus Christ to die.

Prayers Priest

Keep watch, dear Lord, with those who work, or watch, or weep this night, and give your angels charge over those who sleep. Tend the sick, Lord Christ; give rest to the weary, bless the dying, soothe the suffering, pity the afflicted, shield the joyous; and all for your love's sake. *Amen.*

Be present, O merciful God, and protect us through the silent hours of this night, so that we who are wearied by the changes and chances of this fleeting world, may repose upon thy eternal changelessness; through Jesus Christ our Lord. *Amen*.

Betrayal of Jesus + Matthew 26:30-46

After the reading and a period of silence, a sharp noise represents the moment of Jesus' betrayal.

Stripping of the Altar

Then the altar will be stripped for tomorrow's service. Regular attendees may approach the altar to help. The congregation may remain in the church in prayerful silence during the stripping of the altar and afterward. You are encouraged to spend time praying before the reserved Body of Christ at the Altar of Repose before you leave. The candles will be extinguished once the last member of the congregation has left.

The service continues tomorrow at 12:00 noon.
